This award has been given to a multiagency team, voted for by their peers; who in 2019, formed a Mental Health Hub which involved MH Inpatient Units, Community Mental Health Teams and Street Triage Teams. The hub connects a variety of specialists including a Serenity Integrated Mentoring Project Team, Mental Health Crime Investigator and Mental Health Nurse who works in the Police Force Control Room.

Between 01/02/20 – 16/09/20 its formation has resulted in:

- 255 reports of assault across all mental health units;
- This represents a 127% increase in reported crime;
- 75 positive outcomes;
- This represents a 30% success rate compared to the previous success rate of 4% and 9% national average.
